Journeywoman Start

Journeywoman Start is an introductory construction trades program that prepares you with the basic hands-on skills, safety certifications, and experience to begin a career in the construction trades.

Journeywoman Start (JWS) is a hands-on training program that introduces students to a variety of different construction trades:

- welding
- carpentry
- electrical
- plumbing
- mechanics (Fort McMurray)

The program is designed to help students prepare for and succeed as an entry level construction trades apprentice worker.

Specific trades training will be dependent on individual intakes and locations.

Courses & Skills

- Basic safety certifications and first aid training
- Hands-on skills training in workshops for various trades
- Workplace culture and financial literacy
- Academics (math & science) to prepare for Apprenticeship Industry Training entrance exam
- Interview & resume workshops to support employment
- Ongoing mentorship and support through alumni advisors

Pre-Apprenticeship Heavy Equipment Technician

Heavy equipment technicians maintain, repair and overhaul heavy vehicles and industrial heavy equipment, and commercial transport devices connected to or moved by a power unit.

The Pre-Apprenticeship Heavy Equipment Technician program is a four-week training program designed to prepare women to begin their careers as a Heavy Equipment Technician (HET).

Classroom training consists of completion of required safety tickets, hands-on training at Keyano College and WBF best practices to prepare the student to begin employment. This competitive program has 12 seats available and will offer an opportunity for its students to engage in a ten-month employment placement to ensure the hours and experience for their 1st year of technical training as a heavy equipment technician.
